Dangerous Objects (A4)	Probation plus Educational Sanctions	Probation or Suspension plus Educational Sanctions	Firearms normally result in immediate removal from the University
Hazing (A5)	Probation plus Educational Sanctions	Probation or Suspension plus Educational Sanctions	Actual or Potential impact varies weight of individual sanctions Those hazed are also subject to the same sanctioning procedures as those conducting the hazing.
Harassment (A6)	Censure or Probation plus Educational Sanction(s)	Censure or Probation or Suspension plus Educational Sanctions	Actual or Potential impact varies weight of individual sanctions
Physical Misconduct (A7)	Probation or Suspension or Dismissal plus Educational Sanctions	Probation or Suspension or Dismissal plus Educational Sanctions	Actual or Potential impact varies weight of individual sanctions Unprovoked or unwarranted physical aggression normally results in immediate removal from the community
Sexual Misconduct (A8)	Probation or Suspension or Dismissal plus Educational	Probation or Suspension or Dismissal plus Educational	Actual or Potential impact varies weight of individual sanctions Unwanted sexual penetration

Arson (A9)	Probation or Suspension plus Educational Sanctions	Probation or Suspension or Dismissal plus Educational Sanctions	Actual or Potential impact varies weight of individual sanctions Any act of arson that threatens the safety of others normally results in immediate removal from the community
Academic Dishonesty (B1)	Probation or Suspension or Dismissal plus Educational Sanctions	Probation or Suspension or Dismissal plus Educational Sanctions	Minimum recommended sanction is Disciplinary Probation Higher-level students (juniors, seniors, masters and doctoral students) are subject to higher expectations and will typically receive a more serious sanction than a freshman or sophomore engaging in the same behavior
Disruption (B2)	Censure or Probation plus Educational Sanction(s)	Censure or Probation or Suspension plus Educational Sanctions	Actual or Potential impact varies weight of individual sanctions
University Records (B3)	Censure or Probation plus Educational Sanction(s)	Censure or Probation or Suspension plus Educational Sanctions	Actual or Potential impact varies weight of individual sanctions Students who have falsified admissions or financial aid records are typically removed from the University
Academic Materials (B4)	Censure or Probation plus Restitution and Educational Sanction(s)	Censure or Probation or Suspension plus Restitution and Educational Sanctions	Actual or Potential impact varies weight of individual sanctions
Other Regulations (B5)	Censure or Probation plus Restitution (where appropriate) and Educational Sanction(s)	Censure or Probation or Suspension plus Restitution (where appropriate) and Educational Sanctions	Actual or Potential impact varies weight of individual sanctions

Alcohol Policy (C6)	Censure plus E-CHUG Program and Reflection Paper \$50 fine	Probation plus \$100 fine, Early Intervention Basics Course, and Initial Substance Screening (E-CHUG and URICA)	Actual or Potential involvement varies weight of individual sanctions See Sanctioning Guide for more information on minimum required sanctions
Drug Policy (C7)	Probation plus \$100 fine, Educational Workshop, and Reflection Paper	Suspension or Dismissal plus \$200 fine and Educational Sanctions	Actual or Potential involvement varies weight of individual sanctions See Sanctioning Guide for more information on minimum required sanctions
Drug Paraphernalia (C8)	Censure or Probation plus Educational Sanction(s)	Censure or Probation or Suspension plus Educational Sanctions	Actual or Potential involvement varies weight of individual sanctions Sanctions assume no actual drug presence or use

Gambling (C9)	Censure or Probation plus Educational Sanction(s)	Censure or Probation or Suspension plus Educational Sanctions	Actual or Potential impact varies weight of individual sanctions
Abuse of the Disciplinary System (C10)	Probation or Suspension plus Educational Sanctions	Probation or Suspension or Dismissal plus Educational Sanctions	Actual or Potential impact varies weight of individual sanctions Active sanctions that students have failed to complete are also increased
